WE ARE A PEOPLE OF RESURRECTION

We just went through one of the most significant seasons in the Christian calendar, the Lenten season. I cannot share the experiences of others, but to me, this was an important time of deep reflection as I walked the journey to the cross. For some, the cross is a stumbling block, but for those who believe, it is the cornerstone of our faith. So, the darkness and grief of Friday cannot withstand the power of resurrection that we experienced on that glorious Easter Sunday when our Lord rolled back the heavy rock of sin and death.

As we reflect on the days after Easter Sunday, we are reminded that we are a people of resurrection. The joy that filled the disciples when Mary Magdalene reported the savior's resurrection is a testament to this. Beyond Easter, we are called to live in hope, victory, and the power of Christ's resurrection, bearing witness to the gospel, living in expectation of His return, and walking in communion with God and unity with His body, the church.

Some may ask how we can live in the power of Christ's resurrection. As fellow Christians, it can be disheartening if we cling to the grief and suffering of the Friday before Easter Sunday. Then, the word of God in Acts 3:26 tells us, "When God raised up his servant, he sent him first to you to bless you by turning each of you from your wicked ways." Indeed, as the people of resurrection, let us turn away from every wicked ways and embrace the new living hope so that the world will be transformed to live in the hope, victory, and power of Christ's resurrection, bearing witness to the gospel, living in expectation of His return, and walking in communion with God and unity with His body, the church.

May we continually be transformed by the reality of Christ's resurrection as we journey through the days ahead as His disciples.

Spring is officially here. That means the weather will be hot and cold intermittently and our skin will be exposed to rain, sun, wind, and snow. Be prepared. Layer up. You never know if you will need to dress up or down and with layers you can stay comfortable.



Be sure and keep your sun screen and bug spray available also as we spend more time outside. If you have thin hair or are bald, be sure and wear a hat in the sun. Skin Cancer is noted on skin that is exposed to the sun frequently. With our farmers, this is a frequent problem. This is often noted on the head, ears, nose, hands, arms and back- any area exposed to the sun often.

Remember also, while out in the warmer weather, drink more water. Your body needs water to keep hydrated and if you are thirsty, that is often a sign you should have drank more. People who are old or young are more vulnerable to being symptomatic with dehydration and especially those people with low blood pressures.
